AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE RETIREMENT BENEFITS OF A CERTAIN RETIREMENT BENEFICIARY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding the provisions of any general or special law or
2 rule to the contrary, the retirement beneficiary of Philip E. Shea, a
3 former assistant district attorney in the middle district, shall be
4 allowed to purchase credible service for the period of October
5 twenty-third, nineteen hundred and sixty-eight to September
6 fourth, nineteen hundred and seventy, inclusive, pursuant to
7 the provisions of the fourth paragraph of paragraph (h) of subdivi-
8 sion (1) of section four of chapter thirty-two of the General Laws
9 for the purpose of determining the retirement allowance pursuant
10 to the provisions of option (d) of subdivision (2) of section twelve
11 of said chapter thirty-two; provided, however, that said retirement
12 beneficiary shall thereupon receive such increased allowance
13 together with an amount equal to the difference between the
14 allowance said retirement beneficiary actually received from the
15 date of retirement to the date of recalculation and the amount of
16 the allowance which said retirement beneficiary would have
17 received had such recalculation allowance been paid to said retire-
18 ment beneficiary from the date of retirement.
