AN ACT ESTABLISHING A SICK LEAVE BANK FOR CHARLOTTE COLLINS, AN EMPLOYEE OF THE DEPARTMENT OF MENTAL RETARDATION..

1 *Whereas*, The deferred operation of this act would tend to defeat
2 its purpose, which is to immediately establish a sick leave bank for a
3 certain employee of the department of mental retardation, therefore
4 it is hereby declared to be an emergency law necessary for the
5 immediate preservation of the public convenience.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding the provisions of any general or special law or
2 rule or regulation to the contrary, the department of mental retar-
3 dation is hereby authorized and directed to establish a sick leave
4 bank for Charlotte Collins, an employee of said department. Any
5 employee of said department may voluntarily contribute one or
6 more of his sick, personal or vacation days to said sick leave bank
7 for use by said Charlotte Collins.

By Mr. Lusk a joint resolution (S. Res. 100) was introduced and read twice and referred to the Committee on Education and the Arts.
