

SENATE No. 1429

By Ms. Walsh, a petition (accompanied by bill, Senate No. 1429) of Marian Walsh for legislation to direct the State Retirement Board to grant a pension to Alan R. Keith. Public Service.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Ninety-Five.

AN ACT DIRECTING THE STATE RETIREMENT BOARD TO GRANT A CERTAIN PENSION TO ALAN R. KEITH.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of any general or
2 special law to the contrary and in order to promote the public
3 good, the state retirement board is hereby authorized and directed
4 to retire Alan R. Keith, a trooper of the Department of State
5 Police who was seriously injured in the performance of his duties
6 assisting another police officer on May twelfth nineteen hundred
7 and ninety, is totally and permanently incapacitated for further
8 service as a police officer, at a yearly amount of pension equal to
9 the regular rate of compensation he would have been entitled to
10 receive had he continued in service as a state police officer at the
11 grade held by him at the time of his retirement.

12 Said retirement shall become effective as of the date following
13 the last day on which he is entitled to receive regular compensa-
14 tion. Said retirement date is August twenty-fourth, nineteen hun-
15 dred and ninety-three.

1 SECTION 2. Upon the retirement of Alan R. Keith, the state
2 retirement board shall forthwith pay him all amounts standing to
3 his credit in the annuity savings fund of the state retirement
4 system.

1 SECTION 3. The provisions of section one hundred of chapter
2 forty-one of the General Laws shall continue to apply to said Alan
3 R. Keith, relative to his receiving such indemnification by said
4 department for all hospital, medical and related expenses that have
5 been or may be incurred after the date of his retirement as a result
6 of the aforementioned incapacity.

1 SECTION 4. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
