AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS FOR BRISTOL COUNTY TO BORROW MONEY FOR THE REPAIR, RENOVATION, AND CONSTRUCTING, EQUIPPING AND FURNISHING OF BUILDINGS AT BRISTOL AGRICULTURAL SCHOOL IN THE TOWN OF DIGHTON.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The county commissioners of Bristol county are  
2 hereby authorized to raise and expend a sum not exceeding four  
3 hundred thousand dollars for the preparation of plans and specifi-  
4 cations for the repair, renovation, construction, equipping and fur-  
5 nishing facilities for the Bristol Agricultural School. Said  
6 commissioners are hereby authorized to raise and expend a sum  
7 not exceeding five million dollars for the repair, renovation, con-  
8 struction and original equipping and furnishing of said facilities.  
9 Any sums received from the federal government for the purposes  
10 of this act shall be included in, and considered a part of, the total  
11 amount authorized to be expended hereunder.

1 SECTION 2. For the purpose authorized by section one the  
2 treasurer of Bristol county, with the approval of the county com-  
3 missioners, may borrow upon the credit of said county such sums  
4 as may be necessary, not exceeding, in the aggregate, five million  
5 dollars; and, may issue bonds or notes of the county therefor,  
6 which shall bear on their face the words Bristol County School  
7 Loan Act of 1995. Each authorized issue shall constitute a sepa-  
8 rate loan and such loans shall be payable in not more than twenty  
9 years from their dates. The bonds or notes shall be signed by said  
10 county treasurer and countersigned by a majority of said county  
11 commissioners. Said county may sell said securities at public or  
12 private sale, upon such terms and conditions as said county com-  
13 missioners may deem proper, but not for less than their par value.  
14 Indebtedness incurred hereunder shall, except as herein provided,  
15 be subject to chapter thirty-five of the General Laws.
