AN ACT RELATIVE TO APPRENTICE AGREEMENTS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section 11K of chapter 23 of the General Laws, as appearing in
- 2 the 1996 Official Edition, is hereby amended by adding the
- 3 following paragraph: -
- 4 For the purpose of this section, any adjudicated violation by an
- 5 employer of sections 26 to 27H, inclusive, of chapter 149 shall
- 6 constitute a violation of each apprentice agreement maintained by
- 7 the employer. Upon certification by the attorney general of any
- 8 such adjudicated violation the deputy director of apprentice
- 9 training shall disapprove all apprentice agreements maintained or
- 10 proposed by said employer for a period of not less than six
- 11 months nor more than three years.
- 1 SECTION 2. This act shall apply only to adjudicated violations
- 2 of sections 26 to 27H, inclusive, of chapter 149 of the General
- 3 Laws that an employer committed after the effective date of this 4 act
