## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Ninety-Nine.

AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE RECYCLING OF LEAD-ACID AUTOMOTIVE AND MARINE BATTERIES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Chapter 21H of the General Laws, as appearing in the 1992
- 2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting at the end thereof
- 3 the following new sections:-
- 4 Section 9A. (a) No person may place a used automotive or
- 5 marine lead-acid battery in a mixed municipal solid waste facility,
- 6 nor discard or otherwise dispose of an automotive or marine lead-
- 7 acid battery, except by delivery to an automotive or marine lead-
- 8 acid battery retailer or wholesaler, to a collection or recycling
- 9 facility authorized under the laws of the commonwealth, or to a
- 10 secondary lead smelter permitted by the United States
- 11 Environmental Protection Agency (EPA).
- 12 (b) No person who sells automotive or marine lead-acid bat-13 teries at retail, or offers such batteries for retail sale in the com-
- 14 monwealth, may dispose of a used automotive or marine lead-acid
- 15 battery, except by delivery to the agency of a battery wholesaler,
- 16 to a battery manufacturer for delivery to a secondary lead smelter
- 17 permitted by the EPA, or directly to such a secondary lead 18 smelter.
- (c) Any person who violates subsection (a) or (b) of this section shall be punished by a fine of not more than five hundred dollars,
- 21 or by imprisonment of not more than sixty days, or both. Each
- 22 battery improperly discarded shall constitute a separate violation.
- 23 The department shall enforce the provisions of this section.

Section 9A. (a) All persons selling automotive or marine leadacid batteries at retail, or offering automotive or marine lead-acid batteries for retail sale, in the commonwealth, shall:

(1) accept at the point of transfer, from their customers who so offer them, used automotive or marine lead-acid batteries in a quantity at least equal to the number of new batteries purchased; and

- (2) collect a deposit of ten dollars on the sale of any automotive or marine lead-acid battery that is not accompanied by the return of a used automotive or motor vehicle lead-acid battery of the same or similar type, given that said deposit shall inure to the benefit of the retailer unless the person paying the deposit pursuant to this subsection returns a used automotive or marine lead-acid battery to the retailer within thirty days of the date of sale, in which case the deposit shall be returned to the customer; and
- 39 (3) post a sign, at least eight and one-half inches by eleven 40 inches in size, containing the universal recycling symbol and the 41 following language, conspicuously displayed:
  - (i) "It is illegal to discard a motor vehicle or marine battery.";
  - (ii) "Recycle your used batteries here."; and
- 44 (iii) "State law requires us to accept used motor vehicle and 45 marine batteries for recycling."
- 46 (b) The department shall produce, print and distribute the signs, 47 which are required by subdivision (3) of subsection (a), to all 48 premises from which automotive and marine lead-acid batteries 49 are sold at retail or offered for retail sale.
- 50 (c) The department shall enforce the provisions of this section.
  51 In doing so, it may inspect any premises to which this section is
  52 applicable. Any person offering automotive or marine lead-acid
  53 batteries for retail sale who fails to post the required signs shall be

Section 9B. Any person selling new automotive or marine leadacid batteries at wholesale, or offering such batteries for wholesale, shall accept at the point of transfer, from their customers who so offer them, used automotive or marine lead-acid batteries in a quantity at least equal to the number of new batteries purchased. Said battery wholesalers, upon acceptance of used automotive or marine batteries in transfer from an automotive or

- 63 marine battery retailer, shall be allowed a period not to exceed
- 64 ninety days to remove the used batteries from the retailers' point
- 65 of collection.
