AN ACT RELATIVE TO A STUDY OF DENTAL INSURANCE FOR RETIRED PUBLIC EMPLOYEES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 There is hereby established a five member special commission,
2 to consist of the house and senate chairmen of the committees on
3 insurance or their designee, the secretary of administration and
4 finance or his designee, a representative of the Retired state,
5 County and Municipal Employees Association of Massachusetts,
6 and a representative of the Massachusetts Municipal Association
7 for the purpose of making an investigation and study of the imple-
8 mentation and administration of a self-funded dental insurance
9 program for state, teacher, municipal and county retirees. Said
10 commission shall report to the General Court the results of its
11 study and its recommendations, together with drafts of legislation
12 necessary to carry its recommendations into effect by filing the
13 same with the clerk of the House of Representatives on or before
14 the first of November, nineteen hundred and ninety-nine.
