Chap. 179. AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE ELECTION OF OFFICERS IN CREDIT UNIONS.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

Section 15 of chapter 171 of the General Laws, as most recently amended by chapter 64 of the acts of 1981, is hereby amended by striking out the first and second sentences and inserting in place thereof the following sentence:- The directors, at a regular scheduled meeting or at a special meeting of the directors called for that purpose and thereafter at their first meeting after the annual meeting shall elect a president and treasurer and may elect vice presidents and assistant treasurers who may or may not be a director who shall be officers and shall elect such other officers as may be necessary for the transaction of the business of the credit union, and shall elect from their own number a chairman of the board, a clerk, who shall be officers of the corporation, a credit committee of not less than three members, an auditing committee of not less than three nor more than five members, and an investment committee of three members, all of whom shall hold office until their successors are qualified unless sooner removed as hereafter provided. The offices of president and treasurer shall not be held by the same person.

Chap. 180. AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE ANNUAL OBSERVANCE OF SLOVAK INDEPENDENCE DAY.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

Chapter 6 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after section 12HH the following section:-

Section 12II. The governor shall annually issue a proclamation setting apart March fourteenth as Slovak Independence Day, in commemoration of the promulgation of the March fourteenth, nineteen hundred and thirty-nine Declaration of Slovak National Independence which established the Slovak Republic as a sovereign nation-state and recommending that said day be observed in

an appropriate manner by the people.

Chap. 181. AN ACT FURTHER REGULATING THE USE OF CERTAIN INSURANCE PAYMENTS BY MUNICIPALITIES.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

The second sentence of section 53 of chapter 44 of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking out clause (2), as amended by chapter 169 of the acts of 1980, and inserting in place thereof the following clause:-

(2) sums not in excess of ten thousand dollars recovered under the terms of fire or physical damage insurance policy and sums not in excess of ten thousand dollars received in restitution for damage done to such city, town or district property may be used by the officer or department having control of the city, town or district property for the restoration or replacement of such property without specific appropriation and.

Chap. 182. AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF MALDEN TO USE A CERTAIN PARCEL OF PARK LAND IN SAID CITY AS A PUBLIC WAY.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. The city of Malden is hereby authorized to use a certain parcel of land in said city, originally acquired for park purposes for use as a public way, said land being bounded and described as follows:-

Beginning at a point on the northerly side of Malden Street; said point being seven hundred twenty and 93/100 (720.93) feet east of the point of curvature of the northerly side of Malden Street and the easterly line of the Fellsway thence running along the easterly line of Devir Park by the following courses and distances: North 07°-18'-43", East one hundred thirty and 68/100 (130.68) feet, and North 05°-26'-17" East three hundred seventy-three and 15/100 (373.15) feet, to the southerly line of Emerald Street (said description being the easterly line of Davidson Way).

Davidson Way varies in width from approximately 18' to 35' with the westerly boundary being along the face of the chain link fence as it now stands.
