AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE TOWN OF HULL TO LEASE PEMBERTON PIER.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding the provisions of chapter 30B of the General
2 Laws to the contrary, the board of selectmen of the town of Hull,
3 on behalf of the town of Hull, may extend leases with the current
4 lessees for periods of not more than 25 years, for all or portions of
5 Pemberton Pier for uses consistent with a pier facility. The remain-
6 ing provisions of chapter 30B shall continue to apply.
