### AN ACT RELATIVE TO DIVISION OF ADMINISTRATIVE LAW APPEALS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 7 of chapter 118G of the General Laws as amended by  
2 section 340 of chapter 26 of the acts of 2003, is further hereby  
3 amended by striking the third sentence in the second paragraph  
4 and replacing said sentence with the following: "In any appeal of  
5 any matter arising out of the setting of such prospective rates of  
6 reimbursement, the aggrieved party shall be permitted to intro-  
7 duce into the record of such an appeal evidence of facility-specific  
8 or industry-specific costs relating to any year including, without  
9 limitation, the rate year."
