AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE SIZE OF SIGNS ON THE MASSACHUSETTS TURNPIKE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 81A of the General Laws is hereby amended by
2 inserting after section 4 the following new section:—

3 Section 4A. The Turnpike shall not allow any sign advertising
4 any gasoline station, restaurant or other services to be erected or
5 maintained on the Massachusetts Turnpike that is larger than 80
6 square feet in area, excluding supports, or is higher than 30 feet
7 from the ground, measured from the highest part of the sign.
