## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Eighty-One.

AN ACT FURTHER REGULATING A FORMULARY OF INTERCHANGEABLE DRUG PRODUCTS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 12D of Chapter 112 of the General Laws, as most  
2 recently amended by Chapter 707 of the acts of 1977, is hereby  
3 amended by inserting as the 6th paragraph thereof the follow-  
4 ing: —

5 “Notwithstanding the foregoing, in cases of where interchange  
6 would be determined as indicated by the signature of the practi-  
7 tioner on the first signature line, and where the patient requests the  
8 exact drug product prescribed and when the patient of his/her  
9 designee shall verify the request by affixing his/her signature on  
10 the back of the prescription form, then the pharmacist shall dis-  
11 pense the exact drug product as written by the practitioner.”
