AN ACT TO PROTECT THE PAYMENT OF PREVAILING WAGES AND TO PROMOTE THE EXISTENCE OF APPRENTICE PROGRAMS AND HEALTH AND WELFARE PLANS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Any contractor desiring to bid on any construction, alteration or
2 repair work for the commonwealth, the counties, any city or town,
3 or any other political subdivision, shall furnish, in conjunction
4 with such bid, adequate proof of maintaining and meeting all
5 prevailing wage requirements.

6 Additionally, said contractor shall furnish proof of the existence
7 of approved pension and health and welfare plans and an approved
8 apprentice training program to the awarding authority.

9 Failure to provide such proof of employee benefit plans shall
10 cause such bid to be disqualified and removed from consideration.
