AN ACT REPEALING THE MANDATORY SCHOOL ATTENDANCE LAW AND PROHIBITING THE USE OF TAX REVENUE FOR THE OPERATION OF PUBLIC SCHOOLS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section two of chapter seventy-six of the General
2 Laws is hereby repealed.

1 SECTION 2. Notwithstanding provisions of any general or
2 special law to the contrary, neither the commonwealth nor any
3 city, town, or district shall allocate monies or other revenues
4 derived from any taxes, fees, excises, imposts or tariffs for the
5 maintenance, rental, or operation of any educational institution.
