AN ACT MAKING PERMANENT TWO PROVISIONAL APPOINTMENTS AS NATURAL RESOURCE OFFICER, ENGINEER, COASTAL PATROL BOAT, IN THE DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL AFFAIRS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding the provisions of any law to the contrary, the
2 incumbents, on the effective date of this act, in positions numbered
3 0067 and 0068 as provisional natural resource officer, engineer,
4 coastal patrol boat, in the department of environmental affairs,
5 shall be deemed to be permanently appointed to said positions and
6 subject to the civil service law and rules, provided that they meet all
7 requirements for certification and appointment to said position,
8 and further provided that they pass a qualifying examination to
9 which they shall be subjected by the personnel administrator of the
10 division of personnel administration.
