Said commission shall report to the general court the results of its investigations and study, and its recommendations, if any, together with drafts of legislation necessary to carry such recommendations into effect, by filing the same with the clerk of the senate on or before the first Wednesday of July, nineteen hundred and eighty-five.

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Chap. 277. AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE POLICE CADET PROGRAM IN THE CITY OF BOSTON.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 1. of chapter 174 of the acts of 1978 is hereby amended by striking out the first sentence, as amended by section 1 of chapter 560 of the acts of 1979, and inserting in place thereof the following sentence:- Notwithstanding the provisions of chapter thirty-one of the General Laws, any person who has completed not less than two years of service as a police cadet in the police department of the city of Boston, or any person who has completed any such service as a cadet; provided, however, that such person has also completed at least two years of service as a civilian employee of said department performing the same or similar function as performed while a cadet in the police department of said city under the provisions of section twenty-one A of chapter one hundred and forty-seven of the General Laws, or any employee who has completed two years of service as a civilian within said department; provided, further, that he is performing duties similar to those of police cadets and providing also that he, while of eligible age, was unable to obtain appointment during the period from nineteen hundred and seventy-three to nineteen hundred and seventy-eight, when the cadet program was discontinued, may, subject to a program established by the police commissioner of said city and approved by the personnel administrator of the state division of personnel administration and the Massachusetts criminal justice training council, be appointed to fill a vacancy in a position in the lowest grade in the police force of said city without certification from an eligible list prepared under the provisions of chapter thirty-one of the General Laws; and provided, further, that such person either is on a police entrance

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eligible list prepared under said chapter thirty-one or passes a qualifying examination to be given by said personnel administrator.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

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Chap. 278. AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE STATE SECRETARY TO AUTHORIZE THE SOLEMNIZATION OF A CERTAIN MARRIAGE.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of section thirty-nine of chapter two hundred and seven of the General Laws, the state secretary may authorize in the manner set forth under said section thirty-nine, the solemnization of a marriage by Simon S. Cohen, as he is a retired judge of the superior court of the state of Connecticut, in the city of Boston on November tenth, nineteen hundred and eighty-four between Nancy Shapiro of the town of Nahant and William Gutfarb of the town of Nahant, and the state secretary shall issue to said Simon S. Cohen in his capacity as aforesaid a certificate of such authorization.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

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Chap. 279. AN ACT RELATIVE TO CERTAIN CLAIMS AGAINST THE COMMONWEALTH.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 2 of chapter 258 of the General Laws, as appearing in section 15 of chapter 512 of the acts of 1978, is hereby amended by adding the following paragraph:-

Notwithstanding that a public employee shall not be liable for negligent or wrongful acts as described in the preceding paragraph, if a cause of action is improperly commenced against a public employee of the commonwealth alleging injury or loss of property or personal injury or death as the result of the negligent or wrongful act or omission of such employee, said employee may request representation by the public attorney of the com-
