Robinson and other members of the General Court for a change in the law relative to conflict of interest of legislators, the petition (accompanied by resolve, House, No. 6128) of William F. Galvin for an investigation by a special commission (including members of the General Court) relative to the readjustment of district attorney district lines and allocation of resources of district attorney personnel, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 6129) of Haden G. Greenhalgh for a change in the law relative to the dissemination of obscene material, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 6141) of Roy Cohen for legislation to exempt elected, unpaid municipal officers from the conflict-of-interest law relative to the awarding of certain contracts, and the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 6145) of Leonard Segal relative to restricting the requirement that persons disclose social security numbers, reports recommending that the accompanying order (House, No. 6533) ought to be adopted.
