Ordered, That the committee on Natural Resources and Agriculture be authorized to sit during the recess of the General Court for the purpose of making an investigation and study of the subject matter of current house document numbered 99, authorizing the department of environmental management to lease certain premises within the Great Brook Farm State Park, in Carlisle, for establishment and operation of an interpretive farm.

Said committee shall be provided with quarters in the state house or elsewhere, may hold hearings, may require by summons the attendance and testimony of witnesses, may travel, within and without the commonwealth and may expend for expert, legal, clerical, and other services and for expenses such sums as may be appropriated therefor.

Said committee shall report to the General Court from time to time the results of its investigation and study and its recommendations, if any, together with drafts of legislation necessary to carry its recommendations into effect, by filing the same with the clerk of the house of representatives on or before the first Wednesday of December nineteen hundred and eighty-one.
