Stewart relative to the reemployment of civil service employees in cities and towns who have been relieved of employment due to the passage of proposition two and one-half, so-called; and the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 6603) of George Keveryan relative to the reinstatement rights of certain public employees, reports recommending that the accompanying bill (House, No. 6799) ought to pass.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE REINSTATEMENT RIGHTS OF CERTAIN PUBLIC EMPLOYEES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section 39 of chapter 31 of the General Laws, as added by
- 2 section 11 of chapter 393 of the acts of 1978, is hereby amended by
- 3 adding at the end of the first paragraph the following clause:—
- 4 provided, however, that if such separation shall result from the
- 5 operation of section twenty-one C of chapter fifty-nine of the
- 6 General Laws the right to such reinstatement shall be for a six year
- 7 period.
