The committee on Commerce and Labor, to whom were referred the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1238) of Michael W. Morrissey and Alfred A. Minahan, Jr., relative to the time for a written demand for relief under the consumer protection law; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1950) of Andrew S. Natsios relative to employment exclusions under the Employment Security Law; and the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 4189) of Angelo R. Cataldo relative to regulating the inclusion of fuel escalation clauses in leases for residential property, reports recommending that the accompanying order (House, No. 6858) ought to be adopted.

Ordered, That the committee on Commerce and Labor be authorized to sit during the recess of the General Court for the purpose of making an investigation and study of the subject matter of current House documents numbered: 1238, legislation relative to the time for a written demand for relief under the consumer protection law; 1950, legislation relative to employment exclusions under the Employment Security Law; and 4189, legislation relative to regulating the inclusion of fuel escalation clauses in leases for residential property.

Said committee shall be provided with quarters in the State House or elsewhere, may hold public hearings, may travel within the commonwealth, and may expend for clerical and other services and expenses such sums as may be appropriated therefor. Said committee shall report to the General Court the results of its investigation and study and its recommendations, if any, together with drafts for legislation necessary to carry such recommendations into effect by filing the same with the Clerk of the House of Representatives on or before the first Wednesday in December, nineteen hundred and eighty-one.
