The committee on Commerce and Labor, to whom were referred the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1766) of Donald Viens that newspaper advertisements seeking applicants for employment be required to identify positions that are sales positions; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 2714) of Salvatore Ciccarelli, Leo R. Corazzini, Mark E. Lawton, William R. Keating, Robert D. McNeil, Thomas M. Finneran, Gerard D'Amico and others for legislation to make certain changes in the law regulating employment agencies; and the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 3188) of Bruce E. Wetherbee for legislation to establish a placement employee registration board within the Department of Labor and Industries, reports recommending that the accompanying order (House, No. 6859) ought to be adopted.

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*Ordered*, That the committee on Commerce and Labor be authorized to sit during the recess of the General Court for the purpose of making an investigation and study of the subject matter of current House documents numbered: 1766, legislation that newspaper advertisements seeking applicants for employment be required to identify positions that are sales positions; 2714, legislation to make certain changes in the law regulating employment agencies; and 3188, legislation to establish a placement employee registration board within the Department of Labor and Industries.

Said committee shall be provided with quarters in the State House or elsewhere, may hold public hearings, may travel within the commonwealth, and may expend for clerical and other services and expenses such sums as may be appropriated therefor. Said committee shall report to the General Court the results of its investigation and study and its recommendations, if any, together with drafts of legislation necessary to carry such recommendations into effect by filing the same with the Clerk of the House of Representatives on or before the first Wednesday in December, nineteen hundred and eighty-one.
