AN ACT PROVIDING FOR ADJUSTMENT OF THE CIVIL SERVICE SENIORITY DATES OF PATRICK J. CAHILL, A DETECTIVE IN THE CITY OF BOSTON.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the
2 contrary, the length of service of Patrick J. Cahill, a detective, in
3 the police department of the city of Boston, shall, for purposes of
4 computing seniority under the provisions of chapter thirty-one of
5 the General Laws, in the case of Patrick J. Cahill, include the
6 period from May twelfth, nineteen hundred and seventy-nine,
7 inclusive, and shall also include seniority accrued up to May
8 twelfth, nineteen hundred and seventy-six.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any provision of any law or
contract, the words of section 1 of Act No. 1000, approved
August 29, 1916, in the city of Boston, shall be construed
to require the judges of the court of appeals to hold court
