

Bill accompanying the petition of Charles L. Carr for legislation to provide for the preservation in a natural condition of the Blue Hills reservation. Metropolitan Affairs. January 21.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Ten.

AN ACT

To provide for the Preservation of the Blue Hills Reservation in a Natural State.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The metropolitan park commission shall
2 maintain the Blue Hills reservation, as now known and
3 defined, in its natural state. No trees or shrubs shall
4 be cut down or removed except such as have died. The
5 commission, however, is authorized to cut or remove trees
6 or shrubs to extinguish or prevent fires; to destroy pests;
7 to maintain existing streets, ways and paths; and to pre-
8 vent the obstruction of existing views.

1 SECTION 2. No streets, ways or paths shall be opened
2 or constructed in said reservation after the passage of this
3 act except that foot paths not over five feet wide may be
4 built.

1 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
