### AN ACT

Relative to Notices required to be given to Owners of Buildings in which Intoxicating Liquors have been sold Unlawfully.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section fifty-seven of chapter one hundred of the  
2 Revised Laws is hereby amended by inserting in  
3 line four, after the word "owner," the words:—or  
4 agent,— and in line five, by striking out the words  
5 "jurisdiction of such court or magistrate," and in-  
6 serting in place thereof the word:— commonwealth,  
7 — so as to read as follows:— *Section 57.* Upon the  
8 conviction of a person of the illegal keeping or sale  
9 of intoxicating liquor, the court or magistrate by

10 whom he has been convicted shall issue and cause to  
11 be served upon the owner or agent of the building  
12 used for such illegal keeping or sale, if he resides  
13 within the commonwealth and is not the person so  
14 convicted, a written notice that the tenant of said  
15 building has been convicted as aforesaid; and a re-  
16 turn thereof shall be made to the court or magis-  
17 trate issuing it. Such notice, so served, shall be  
18 deemed to be due and sufficient notice, under the  
19 provisions of section eleven of chapter one hundred  
20 and one.
