AN ACT

To incorporate the Fogg Library, to be Situated in
South Weymouth.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same,
as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Henry B. Reed, Edward B. Nevin,
2 Arthur C. Heald, Gordon Willis and John H.
3 Stetson, their associates and successors, are hereby
4 made a corporation by the name of the Fogg
5 Library, to be situated in that part of the town
6 of Weymouth, called South Weymouth, for the pur-
7 pose of establishing and maintaining a free library
8 or reading room or both in South Weymouth with
9 all the powers and privileges and subject to all the
10 provisions contained in chapter one hundred and
11 twenty-five of the Revised Laws and acts in amend-
12 ment thereof and in addition thereto.

1 SECTION 2. William H. Bolster, Henry B. Reed
2 and John H. Stetson, trustees under the will of
3 John S. Fogg of Weymouth, of a certain fund for
4 the establishment and maintenance of the Fogg

5 Library are hereby authorized to convey to said
6 corporation all property and estate real and per-
7 sonal which they now hold as said trustees including
8 all property so bequeathed and devised to them by
9 the said John S. Fogg for said purpose and all
10 other property real or personal which has since
11 been given, bequeathed or devised to said trustees
12 for the use of said library and said corporation
13 shall hold said property upon the trusts and for the
14 purposes provided and declared by the several
15 donors thereof.

1 SECTION 3. Said corporation may receive, hold
2 and apply to the uses of the corporation real and
3 personal property to an amount not exceeding in
4 the aggregate two hundred and fifty thousand dol-
5 lars and may, subject to any restrictions which are
6 imposed by the donor or testator, from time to
7 time as the proper investment thereof requires, sell
8 and convey at public or private sale any property
9 held by it investing the proceeds thereof for the
10 uses and purposes herein set forth or referred to
11 or the uses and purposes for which any portion of
12 the property held by it may have been expressly
13 given or bequeathed.

1 SECTION 4. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
