AN ACT

To provide for the Relief of the Widow and Children of
John J. Nagle.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same,
as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. There shall be paid from the treasury
2 of the commonwealth a sum of twelve dollars monthly
3 to Annie J. Nagle, widow of John J. Nagle, who died
4 in August, nineteen hundred and nine, from an illness
5 contracted in the service of the commonwealth, as a
6 member of the militia, so long as the said Annie J.
7 Nagle remains unmarried; and there shall be paid to
8 her, for the support of her two children, the sum of
9 four dollars a month for each child until the child
10 attains the age of sixteen years.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
