

AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE TOWN OF GREENFIELD TO APPROPRIATE MONEY TO PROVIDE FACILITIES FOR HOLDING IN SAID TOWN DURING THE CURRENT YEAR THE ANNUAL REUNION OF THE ONE HUNDRED AND FOURTH UNITED STATES INFANTRY VETERANS ASSOCIATION, AMERICAN EXPEDITIONARY FORCES. Chap. 18

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

SECTION 1. The town of Greenfield may appropriate a sum, not exceeding fifteen hundred dollars, for the purpose of providing proper facilities for public entertainment at the time of the annual reunion of the one hundred and fourth United States infantry veterans association, American expeditionary forces, to be held in said town during the current year and of paying the expenses incidental to such entertainment. Money so appropriated shall be expended under the direction and control of the board of selectmen of said town.

Town of Greenfield may appropriate a certain sum of money to provide facilities for holding annual reunion of one hundred and fourth United States infantry veterans association, American expeditionary forces.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE TOWN OF HOLBROOK TO BORROW MONEY FOR SCHOOL PURPOSES. Chap. 19

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

SECTION 1. For the purpose of remodelling the Sumner high school building and for constructing an addition to said building, such addition to increase the floor space of said building, and for originally equipping and furnishing such addition, the town of Holbrook may borrow from time to time, within a period of five years from the passage of this act, such sums as may be necessary, not exceeding, in the aggregate, one hundred and twenty thousand dollars, and may issue bonds or notes therefor, which shall bear on their face the words, Holbrook School Loan, Act of 1928. Each authorized issue shall constitute a separate loan, and such loans shall be paid in not more than fifteen years from their dates, but no issue shall be authorized under this act unless a sum equal to an amount not less than ten per cent of such authorized issue is voted for the same purpose to be raised by the tax levy of the year when authorized. Two thirds of the indebtedness incurred under this act shall be in excess of the statutory limit, but shall, except as provided herein, be subject to chapter forty-four of the General Laws, exclusive of the proviso inserted in section seven of said chapter by chapter three hundred and thirty-eight of the acts of nineteen hundred and twenty-three.

Town of Holbrook may borrow money for school purposes.

Holbrook School Loan, Act of 1928.

SECTION 2. Chapter one hundred and forty-three of the acts of nineteen hundred and twenty-seven is hereby repealed.

Repeal.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
