## Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Seventy-Six.

### AN ACT

To incorporate the Boston Sugar Warehousing Company.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECT. 1. Horatio Harris, Andrew S. Tozier,  
2 Benjamin F. Burgess and Elisha Atkins, their  
3 associates and successors, are hereby made a  
4 corporation by the name of the Boston Sugar  
5 Warehousing Company, for the purpose of re-  
6 ceiving and storing, in bond or otherwise, sugar,  
7 molasses and other bulky articles of merchandise  
8 coming to the port of Boston for sale or manu-  
9 facture ; and the said corporation is hereby  
10 authorized to purchase and hold in fee simple,  
11 or to lease, personal and real estate sufficient for  
12 these purposes in that part of Boston known as  
13 South Boston.

1 SECT. 2. The capital stock of the said corpora-  
2 tion shall not exceed three millions of dollars,  
3 and shall be divided into shares of the par value  
4 of one hundred dollars each.

1 SECT. 3. The said corporation shall have all  
2 the powers and privileges, and shall be subject  
3 to all the duties, restrictions and liabilities set  
4 forth in all the general laws which are now or  
5 hereafter may be in force relating to such cor-  
6 porations.
