In the Year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty-Six.

AN ACT

Concerning Beaches in the Town of Swampscott.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

- 1 SECT. 1. No person shall carry away or remove,
- 2 by land or water, any sand, stones, gravel or mud,
- 3 from the several beaches in the town of Swampscott,

4 known as King's Beach, Blaney's Beach and Whale
5 Beach, without permission first obtained from the se-
6 lectmen of said town, or from some person or persons
7 duly authorized by the said selectmen to grant such
8 permission.

1 SECT. 2. Any person who shall offend against any
2 of the provisions of this act, shall forfeit and pay for
3 each offence a sum not exceeding twenty dollars, to
4 be recovered by complaint or indictment in any court
5 of competent jurisdiction, one-half for the use of the
6 complainant,—the other half for the use of the said
7 town.

1 SECT. 3. This act shall take effect from and after
2 its passage.
