## Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Seventy-Six.

### AN ACT

Making additional appropriations for certain expenditures authorized in eighteen hundred and seventy-five and previous years.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECT. 1. The sums hereinafter mentioned are  
2 appropriated, to be paid from the ordinary revenue,  
3 except in cases otherwise ordered, for the purposes  
4 specified herein, to wit:—

5 For printing and binding ordered by the senate  
6 and house of representatives, two thousand seven  
7 hundred sixty-six dollars and thirty-five cents.  
8 [Res. 1856, chap. 74.]

9 For stationery, printing, etc., ordered by the  
10 sergeant-at-arms, forty-two dollars and thirty-  
11 seven cents. [Res. 1856, chap. 74.]

12 For contingent expenses of the senate and  
13 house of representatives, and necessary expenses  
14 in and about the state house, five hundred sixty  
15 dollars and thirty-two cents. [Gen. Stat., chap. 14.]

16 For repairs in and about the state house, during  
17 the previous year, one thousand four hundred  
18 seventy-five dollars and thirty-nine cents. [Gen.  
19 Stat., chap. 14.]

20 For expenses connected with house number  
21 thirty-three Pemberton square, four hundred sixty-  
22 seven dollars and fifty cents. [Res. 1873, chap.  
23 47.]

24 For contingent expenses of the executive coun-  
25 cil, three hundred forty-one dollars and twenty-  
26 seven cents. [Gen. Stat., chap. 14.]

27 For council postage, printing, etc., one hundred  
28 twenty dollars and ninety-five cents. [Gen. Stat.,  
29 chap. 14.]

30 For printing and binding the public series of  
31 documents for the year eighteen hundred and  
32 seventy-four, eight thousand four hundred ninety-  
33 six dollars and forty cents. [Gen. Stat., chap. 4.]

34 For term reports, one thousand two hundred  
35 and fourteen dollars. [Gen. Stat., chap. 121.]

36 For extra clerical assistance in the secretary's  
37 department, eighty-nine dollars and sixty-three  
38 cents. [Gen. Stat., chap. 14.]

39 For militia compensation, four thousand one  
40 hundred seventy-five dollars and seventy-five  
41 cents. [Acts 1874, chap. 320.]

42 For expenses of transportation of the militia,  
43 seven thousand three hundred ninety-four dollars  
44 and ninety-five cents. [Acts 1874, chap. 320.]

45 For expenses of the bureau of the quartermas-  
46 ter-general, two thousand nine hundred ninety-  
47 four dollars and seventy-seven cents. [Acts 1874,  
48 chap. 320.]

49 For quartermaster's supplies, two thousand four

50 hundred thirty-nine dollars and sixty-eight cents.

52 For military accounts, five hundred sixty-six  
53 dollars and sixty-six cents: [Acts 1874, chap. 320.]

54 For the current expenses of the state almshouse  
55 at Tewksbury, three thousand two hundred ninety-  
56 eight dollars and forty-seven cents. [Gen. Stat.,  
57 chap. 71.]

58 For the tuition of state beneficiaries in the Bos-  
59 ton school for deaf mutes, three hundred eighty-  
60 two dollars and sixty-four cents. [Res. 1847,  
61 chap. 94; 1864, chap. 38; 1865, chap. 50; Acts  
62 1869, chap. 333.]

63 For the reimbursement of cities and towns for  
64 expenses incurred in the transportation of state  
65 paupers to the state almshouse, seventy-two dol-  
66 lars and fifty cents. [Acts 1872, chap. 45.]

67 For the current expenses of the industrial school  
68 for girls at Lancaster, a sum not exceeding four  
69 thousand five hundred nineteen dollars and thirty-  
70 seven cents. [Gen. Stat., chap. 75.]

71 For expenses incurred in taking the industrial  
72 statistics and decennial census of the Common-  
73 wealth, a sum not exceeding forty-three thousand  
74 seven hundred seventy-eight dollars and twenty-  
75 eight cents. [Acts 1874, chap. 386; Res. 1875,  
76 chap. 37.]

77 For expenses incurred by the bureau of statis-  
78 tics on the subject of labor, four hundred and  
79 seven dollars and twenty-two cents. [Res. 1870,  
80 chap. 74.]

81 For compensation and expenses of the harbor  
82 commissioners, five hundred and three dollars and  
83 twenty-eight cents. [Acts 1866, chap. 149.]

84 The unexpended balance of the appropriation  
85 authorized by chapter three hundred and sixty  
86 of the acts of the year eighteen hundred and  
87 seventy-two, and chapter three hundred and nine-  
88 teen of the acts of the year eighteen hundred and  
89 seventy-four, for the erection of memorial statues  
90 in the national capitol at Washington, is hereby  
91 made applicable to the same purpose for the  
92 present year.

93 The unexpended balance of the appropriation  
94 authorized by chapter three hundred and four of  
95 the acts of the year eighteen hundred and seventy-  
96 four, entitled "An Act to provide for the improve-  
97 ment of Boston harbor at junction shoal," is  
98 hereby made applicable to the same purpose for  
99 the present year.

100 The unexpended balance of the appropriation  
101 authorized by chapter three hundred and twenty  
102 of the acts of the year eighteen hundred and  
103 seventy-two, and chapter twelve of the acts of the  
104 year eighteen hundred and seventy-four, for the  
105 improvement of the Commonwealth flats in Bos-  
106 ton harbor, is hereby made applicable to the same  
107 purpose for the present year.

108 For compensation for lectures before the board  
109 of agriculture, thirty-one dollars and seventy-five  
110 cents. [Acts 1869, chap. 96.]

111 For expenses of the secretary of the board of  
112 agriculture, a sum not exceeding twenty-five dol-  
113 lars. [Gen. Stat., chap. 16.]

1 SECT. 2. This act shall take effect upon its  
2 passage.
