AN ACT

Providing for the Support of Pupils admitted under the designation of the Governor, to the Massachusetts School for Idiotic and Feeble-Minded Youth.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECT. 1. There shall be allowed and paid out
2 of the treasury of Commonwealth, annually, from
3 the appropriation for the Massachusetts School for
4 Idiotic and Feeble-Minded Youth, to the trustees
5 of said school, the sum of three dollars and fifty
6 cents per week, for the support of each pupil who
7 has been or shall be admitted to said school by the
8 designation of the governor, under chapter forty-
9 four of the resolves of the year eighteen hundred
10 and fifty-one, and chapter twenty-six of the resolves
11 of the year eighteen hundred and sixty-one; but
12 not exceeding fifty-five in number.

1 SECT. 2. The grants of an annual sum of
2 money made to said school in chapter twenty-six

3 of the resolves of the year eighteen hundred sixty-
4 one, chapter nine of the resolves of the year eight-
5 een hundred sixty-nine, and chapter eighteen of
6 the resolves of the year eighteen hundred seventy-
7 four are hereby repealed.
