AN ACT

To Authorize the Towns of Dennis and Yarmouth to Regulate the Salmon and Trout Fishery in Bass River.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :

1 SECTION 1. Section one of chapter thirty-seven of
2 the acts of the year eighteen hundred and forty-nine,
3 entitled "An Act to authorize the towns of Dennis
4 and Yarmouth to regulate the fisheries in Bass
5 River," is hereby amended by inserting after the
6 words "herrings or alewives and perch," the words
7 "salmon and trout;" and after the words "Bass
8 River," the words "at the mouth thereof;" and sec-
9 tion four of said chapter is hereby amended, by in-
10 serting after the words "herrings, alewives, or
11 perch," the words "or salmon or trout," and by

12 striking out of the last line of said section four the
13 word “ forty,” and inserting in lieu thereof the word
14 “ twenty.”

1 SECT. 2. This act shall take effect upon its pas-
2 sage.
