RESOLVE

Relative to the Appointment of a Committee to consider the Matter of erecting a Public Memorial to the Soldiers and Sailors who fought in the European War.

1 *Resolved*, That the governor of the commonwealth with
2 the advice and consent of the council is hereby authorized
3 to appoint a committee, one of whom he shall designate
4 as chairman, and all of whom shall serve without com-
5 pensation, to consider the matter of erecting a public
6 memorial to the soldiers and sailors who fought in the
7 war with the German imperial government and Austria,
8 and to recommend to the next general court such legisla-
9 tion as it may deem proper concerning the location, char-
10 acter and cost of such memorial.

IN RESPONSE TO A RESOLUTION PASSED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES ON FEBRUARY 18, 1974, AND AMENDED THEREON, AUTHORIZING THE COMMITTEE ON INVESTIGATION TO INQUIRE INTO THE CONDUCT OF THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES IN THE EXERCISE OF HIS POWERS, AND TO REPORT THEREON TO THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES.

1. That the Committee on Investigation of the House of Representatives, created by the resolution of the House of Representatives on February 18, 1974, and amended thereon, is hereby authorized to conduct its investigation and to report thereon to the House of Representatives.
2. That the Committee on Investigation shall have the right to hold public hearings and to receive testimony from any person who may have information concerning the conduct of the President of the United States in the exercise of his powers.
3. That the Committee on Investigation shall have the right to subpoena any person who may have information concerning the conduct of the President of the United States in the exercise of his powers.
4. That the Committee on Investigation shall have the right to examine any documents, records, or other information in the possession, custody, or control of any person who may have information concerning the conduct of the President of the United States in the exercise of his powers.
