Bill accompanying the petition of Daniel C. Murphy that Daniel J. O'Sullivan be reinstated in the public works department of the city of Boston. Cities. January 10.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Nineteen.

AN ACT

Relative to the Reinstatement of Daniel J. O'Sullivan in the
Public Works Department of the City of Boston.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the
same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Daniel J. O'Sullivan, formerly an in-
2 spector in the sanitary division of the public works de-
3 partment of the city of Boston, may, with the approval
4 of the mayor and the commissioner of public works, be
5 reappointed as such inspector without passing a civil
6 service examination.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

That the Commission on the Administration of the State Government be authorized to conduct such investigations as may be necessary to determine the efficiency of the various departments of the State Government, and to report thereon to the House of Representatives.

THE COMMISSION ON THE ADMINISTRATION OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT.

As amended by the Senate and the House of Representatives.

AN ACT

To provide for the establishment of a Commission on the Administration of the State Government, and to provide for the duties of such Commission.

That the Commission on the Administration of the State Government be authorized to conduct such investigations as may be necessary to determine the efficiency of the various departments of the State Government, and to report thereon to the House of Representatives.

1. The Commission on the Administration of the State Government shall be composed of five members, to be appointed by the Governor, and shall have the honor of the rank of Major-General in the Army of the United States. The Commission shall hold office until the expiration of its term, and shall be eligible for reappointment.

2. The Commission shall have the right to call upon any department of the State Government for such information as may be necessary to enable it to perform its duties.

3. The Commission shall have the right to hold public hearings, and to receive testimony from any person who may be interested in the subject matter of its investigations.

4. The Commission shall have the right to employ such personnel as may be necessary to enable it to perform its duties, and to fix the compensation of such personnel.

5. The Commission shall have the right to make such recommendations as it may deem proper to the Governor, and to the Senate and the House of Representatives.

6. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
