

Bill accompanying the petition of Barnet Lerner that persons licensed as junk dealers shall be legal residents. Legal Affairs. January 14.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Nineteen.

AN ACT

To provide that Junk Licenses shall be granted to Residents only.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section twenty-nine of chapter one hundred and two of
2 the Revised Laws is hereby amended by adding after the
3 word "persons", in line three, the words:— who are
4 legal residents of the city or town, — so as to read as fol-
5 lows:— *Section 29.* The mayor of any city except
6 Boston, and in Boston, the police commissioner, and the
7 selectmen of any town, if ordinances or by-laws therefor
8 have been adopted in such city or town, may license
9 suitable persons who are legal residents of the city or
10 town to be dealers in and keepers of shops for the pur-
11 chase, sale or barter of junk, old metals or second-hand
12 articles, in such city or town, subject to the provisions of
13 section one hundred and eighty-six to one hundred and
14 eighty-nine, inclusive, and may revoke such license at
15 pleasure.
