AN ACT

Relative to the Identity of Persons filing Income Tax Returns.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section sixteen of chapter two hundred and sixty-nine
2 of the General Acts of nineteen hundred and sixteen is
3 hereby amended by striking out the last paragraph thereof
4 and substituting the following:— The tax commissioner
5 shall, upon the request of any inhabitant of the common-
6 wealth, state whether or not any designated person has
7 filed an income tax return for the current or prior year.
