The committee on Ways and Means, to whom were referred the Bill to authorize the Metropolitan Park Commission to take certain measures for the protection of the public health in and along the Charles river in the cities of Newton and Watertown (House, No. 546), the Bill to enable the Metropolitan Park Commission to construct a dam and a tide gate in Furnace Brook parkway where the same crosses Black's creek in the city of Quincy (House, No. 645), and the Bill to provide work in completing the construction of metropolitan boulevards and roadways already authorized by law (House, No. 1576), report (in part on House, No. 1576) the accompanying bill.

## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Nineteen.

### AN ACT

To enable the Metropolitan Park Commission to make or complete Needed Improvements on the Reservations and Parkways under Its Control not provided for in the Appropriations for Ordinary Maintenance Expenses.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. In order to enable the metropolitan park  
2 commission to make needed improvements in the res-  
3 ervations and parkways under its control which are not  
4 provided for in the appropriations for ordinary main-  
5 tenance expenses, said commission may expend a further  
6 sum not exceeding thirty-five thousand dollars out of  
7 the Metropolitan Parks Maintenance Fund.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
