RESOLVE

Granting a County Tax for the County of Berkshire.

1 *Resolved*, That the following sums are hereby appro-
2 priated for the expenses of the county of Berkshire, for
3 the year nineteen hundred and nineteen:

4 For interest on county debt, a sum not exceeding four
5 thousand dollars.

6 For salaries of county officers and assistants, fixed by
7 law, a sum not exceeding seventeen thousand five hun-
8 dred dollars.

9 For clerical assistance in county offices, a sum not
10 exceeding six thousand two hundred and fifty dollars.

11 For salaries and expenses of district and police courts,
12 a sum no exceeding twenty-nine thousand five hundred
13 dollars.

14 For salaries of jailers, masters and assistants, and
15 support of prisoners in jails and houses of correction, a
16 sum not exceeding thirty thousand dollars.

17 For criminal costs in the superior court, a sum not
18 exceeding nine thousand dollars.

19 For civil expenses in the supreme judicial and superior
20 courts, a sum not exceeding six thousand dollars.

21 For transportation expenses of county and associate
22 commissioners, a sum not exceeding four hundred dollars.

23 For medical examiners, inquests, and commitments
24 of the insane, a sum not exceeding four thousand five
25 hundred dollars.

26 For auditors, masters and referees, a sum not exceeding
27 two thousand dollars.

28 For building county buildings, a sum not exceeding
29 five hundred dollars.

30 For repairing, furnishing and improving county build-
31 ings, a sum not exceeding five thousand dollars.

32 For fuel, lights and supplies in county buildings, other
33 than jails and houses of correction, and for care of the
34 same, a sum not exceeding seven thousand five hundred
35 dollars.

36 For highways, including state highways, bridges and
37 land damages, a sum not exceeding seventy-five thou-
38 sand dollars.

39 For law libraries, a sum not exceeding eight hundred
40 dollars.

41 For training school, a sum not exceeding fifteen hun-
42 dred dollars.

43 For county aid to agriculture, a sum not exceeding
44 six thousand dollars.

45 For a hospital or sanatorium, a sum not exceeding
46 one thousand dollars.

47 For miscellaneous and contingent expenses of the
48 current year, a sum not exceeding six thousand dollars.

49 For the care and maintenance of Greylock state reser-
50 vation, a sum not exceeding three thousand dollars.

51 For the care and maintenance of Mount Everett state
52 reservation, a sum not exceeding one thousand dollars.

53 For pensions, a sum not exceeding one thousand one
54 hundred and twenty-five dollars.

55 And the county commissioners of said county are

56 hereby authorized to levy as the county tax of said
57 county for the current year, in the manner provided by
58 law, the sum of one hundred ninety-nine thousand seven
59 hundred ninety-eight dollars and five cents, to be ex-
60 pended, together with the cash balance on hand and the
61 receipts from other sources, for the above purposes.
