AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE ARREST FOR ATTEMPTED ARSON.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 5A of Chapter 266 of the General Laws is hereby
2 amended by inserting after the second paragraph the following
3 paragraph: —

4 Any officer qualified to serve criminal process may arrest
5 without a warrant, any person, whom he has probable cause to
6 believe has or is violating any provision of this section.
