AN ACT REPEALING THE LAW RELATIVE TO DISORDERLY HOUSES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 53 of chapter 272 of the General Laws, as most recently
2 amended by chapter 304 of the acts of 1959, is hereby further
3 amended by striking in line 6, the phrase "disorderly houses."
