AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE POSITION OF STATE POLICE DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT-INSPECTOR.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 20 of chapter 31 of the General Laws is
2 hereby amended by striking out the first sentence and inserting in
3 place thereof the following sentence: —

4 Section 20 of chapter 31 of the General Laws is hereby
5 amended by striking out the first sentence and inserting in place
6 thereof the following sentence: —

7 Appointments and promotions in such police and fire forces of
8 cities and towns as are within the official service, in the capitol
9 police force and in the police force of the metropolitan district
10 commission shall be made only by competitive examination,
11 except as otherwise provided in this chapter.

1 SECTION 2. The first paragraph of section 6 of chapter 22 of
2 the General Laws is hereby amended by striking out the last
3 sentence thereof and inserting in place thereof the following
4 sentence: —

5 The commissioner shall establish the requirements and
6 qualifications for officers and inspectors appointed pursuant to
7 this section except that as vacancies occur in the position of state
8 police detective lieutenant-inspector, those duties will be
9 performed by state police non-commissioned officers appointed
10 under section 9A of chapter 22.
