Chap. 429. AN ACT PROVIDING FUNDS FOR EMERGENCY REMEDIAL MEASURES TO PREVENT CIVIL DISORDERS IN THE CITY OF LAWRENCE.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. To provide for supplementing certain items in the general appropriation act and for certain new activities and projects, the sums set forth in section two, for the several purposes and subject to the provisions of law regulating the disbursement of public funds and the conditions pertaining to appropriations in chapter two hundred and thirty-four of the acts of nineteen hundred and eighty-four, are hereby appropriated from the General Fund, unless specifically designated otherwise, for the fiscal year ending June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and eighty-five or for such period as may be specified, the sums so appropriated to be in addition to any amounts available for the purpose.

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emergency cleanup of an oil spill caused by the rupture of oil tanks and the replacement of said tanks, near the headwaters of the Ipswich river in the town of Wilmington; provided, however, that this appropriation shall expire on June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and eighty-five \$75,000

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

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Chap. 430. AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE TERMS OF CERTAIN BONDS AND NOTES TO BE ISSUED BY THE COMMONWEALTH.

Whereas, The deferred operation of this act would tend to defeat its purpose, which is to immediately facilitate the issuance of bonds and notes to carry out the purposes of various acts passed during the regular annual legislative session of the year nineteen hundred and eighty-three, therefore it is hereby declared to be an emergency law, necessary for the immediate preservation of the public convenience.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the bonds or notes which the state treasurer is authorized to issue under section three of chapter three hundred and twenty-five of the acts of nineteen hundred and eighty-three providing funds for renovations and equipment for the purpose of televising sessions of the house of representatives shall be issued for a maximum term not exceeding five years; provided, however, that all such bonds or notes shall be payable by June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and eighty-nine as recommended by the governor in a message to the general court dated May eighteenth, nineteen hundred and eighty-four in pursuance of Section 3 of Article LXII of the Amendments to the Constitution of the Commonwealth.

SECTION 2. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the bonds which the state treasurer is authorized to issue under section two of chapter three hundred and twenty-seven of the acts of nineteen hundred and eighty-three providing for a capital outlay program relative to the Massachusetts Technology Park Corporation shall be issued for terms not to exceed twenty years; provided, however, that all such bonds shall be payable by June thirtieth, two thousand and eight, and
