By Mr. Whitney of Dudley, petition of A. James Whitney that provision be made for the appointment of an additional associate medical examiner for Worcester County. Health Care.

AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF AN ADDITIONAL ASSOCIATE MEDICAL EXAMINER FOR WORCESTER COUNTY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 1 of chapter 38 of the General Laws is hereby amended
2 by striking out the second paragraph, as most recently amended
3 by section 1 of chapter 859 of the acts of 1973, and inserting in
4 place thereof the following paragraph: —

5 Two examiners and two associate examiners in Suffolk county,
6 one examiner and two associate examiners in Nantucket county
7 and in district two in Barnstable county, and one additional
8 associate examiner in district seven and eight in Worcester
9 county, and one examiner and one associate examiner in each of
10 the following districts shall be so appointed.

THE CONSTITUTION OF THE UNITED STATES

ARTICLE I. SECTION 1.

All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.

Representatives and direct Taxes shall be apportioned among the several States which may be admitted to or separated from the Union, according to their respective Numbers, which shall be determined by the following Rule, to-wit: That the whole Number of free Persons, (including Indians taxed) in each State shall be taken as the Basis, to which shall be added three fifths of all other Persons, (including Indians not taxed) in each State, and the whole sum shall be multiplied by three Representatives, and the Product divided by the Number of the States, so that the Quotient shall be a Representative for each State.
