AN ACT PROVIDING THAT COURT OFFICERS IN THE DISTRICT COURTS OF MIDDLESEX COUNTY BE APPOINTED BY THE MIDDLESEX COUNTY COMMISSIONERS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 61 of chapter 218 of the General Laws, as most recently
2 amended by chapter 704 of the acts of 1971, is hereby further
3 amended by striking out the first sentence and inserting in place
4 thereof the following two sentences:— Court officers in district
5 and juvenile courts, except those in Middlesex county, shall be
6 appointed by the justice of the court or, in the case of the
7 municipal court of the city of Boston, by a majority of the
8 justices, and may likewise be removed for any cause considered
9 by such justice or majority to be sufficient, and any vacancy
10 caused by removal or otherwise may likewise be filled. In
11 Middlesex county court officers in the district courts shall be
12 appointed by the Middlesex county commissioners and may be
13 removed by any cause considered by the Middlesex county
14 commissioners to be sufficient and any vacancy therein shall be
15 likewise filled by said county commissioners.
