In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy-Seven.

AN ACT DESIGNATING MAY TWENTY-NINTH OF EACH YEAR A MASSACHUSETTS LEGAL HOLIDAY IN HONOR OF JOHN FITZGERALD KENNEDY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

Section 7 of chapter 4 of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking out clause Eighteenth, as most recently amended by chapter 112 of the acts of 1976, and inserting in place thereof the following clause:—

Eighteenth, "Legal Holiday" shall include January the first, January the fifteenth, July the fourth and Christmas day, or the day following when any of said days occur on Sunday, and the third Monday in February, the third Monday in April, the last Monday in May, the first Monday in September, the second Monday in October, November eleventh, Thanksgiving day and May twenty-ninth of each year in honor of John Fitzgerald Kennedy.

"Legal holiday" shall also include, with respect to Suffolk county only, March the seventeenth and June the seventeenth, or the day following when said days occur on Sunday; provided, however, that the words "legal holiday" as used in section forty-five of chapter one hundred and forty-nine shall not include March the seventeenth, or the day following when said day occurs on Sunday.
