By Mr. Woodward of Walpole, petition of Francis H. Woodward (by vote of the town) that the office of chief of police of the town of Walpole be exempt from the civil service law and rules. Public Service. [Local Approval Received.]

AN ACT PROVIDING THAT THE OFFICE OF CHIEF OF POLICE OF THE TOWN OF WALPOLE SHALL BE EXEMPT FROM THE CIVIL SERVICE LAW AND RULES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The office of chief of police of the town of
2 Walpole shall be exempt from the provisions of chapter thirty-
3 one of the General Laws.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
