Gillet, Jr. (with the approval of the mayor and city council) that Thomas Stapleton be authorized to take a civil service qualifying examination of the position of director of the council on aging for the city of Fall River. AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE APPOINTING AUTHORITY OF THE CITY OF FALL RIVER TO APPOINT THOMAS STAPLETON AS DIRECTOR FALL RIVER COUNCIL ON AGING UNDER THE CIVIL SERVICE LAW UPON HIS PASSING A QUALIFYING EXAMINATION.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding the provisions of any general or special law to
2 the contrary, Thomas Stapleton, acting director, Fall River
3 council on aging, shall be given a qualifying examination by the
4 administrator of the division of personnel administration in the
5 office of administration and finance for the position of director,
6 Fall River council on aging, and if he passes said examination the
7 appointment authority of the city of Fall River may appoint him to
8 said position and he shall upon appointment be deemed to be
9 permanently appointed under the provisions of the civil service law
10 and rules.
