AN ACT RELATIVE TO CIGARETTE TAXES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding the provisions of any general or special law
2 to the contrary, during fiscal year nineteen hundred and ninety-
3 three all monies raised through the increase in the cigarette tax
4 shall be spent on anti-smoking programs for all ages; during fiscal
5 year nineteen hundred and ninety-four one-half, during fiscal year
6 nineteen hundred and ninety-five two-thirds and during fiscal year
7 nineteen hundred ninety-six ninety percent of all monies raised
8 shall be distributed to cities and towns for the purpose of health
9 education of children in grades kindergarten through grade six
10 with an emphasis on teaching children about the hazards of
11 smoking.
