

By Mr. Landers of Palmer, petition of AFSCME Council 93 and Patrick F. Landers III relative to the retirement rights of electricians and elevator repairmen employed at public higher education institutions. Public Service.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Ninety-Three.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE RETIREMENT RIGHTS OF ELECTRICIANS AND ELEVATOR REPAIRMEN EMPLOYED AT PUBLIC HIGHER EDUCATION INSTITUTIONS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 3(g) of chapter 32 of the Massachusetts General Laws
2 is hereby amended by adding the following new language:
3 Group 2. Public works building police, permanent watershed
4 guards and permanent park police; University of Massachusetts
5 police; employees of the Massachusetts Port Authority;
6 comprising guards, guard sergeants, head guard and chief of
7 waterfront police, officials and employees of the department of
8 public safety having police powers; employees of a municipal
9 department who are employed as fire or police signal operators
10 of signal maintenance repairmen; ambulance attendants of a
11 municipal department who are required to respond to fires and
12 perform duties assigned to them; employees of a city or town who
13 are employed as licensed electricians and elevator maintenance
14 men employed by a county; employees of the Commonwealth or
15 any county, regardless of any official classification, except sheriff,
16 superintendent, assistant deputy superintendent and correction
17 officers of county correctional facilities, whose regular and major
18 duties require them to have the care, custody, instruction or other
19 supervision of prisoners; and employees of the Commonwealth
20 or of any county whose regular and major duties require them
21 to have the care, custody, instruction or other supervision of

22 parolees or persons who are mentally ill or mentally defective or
23 defective delinquents or wayward children and employees of
24 Cushing Hospital; and all electricians and elevator repairmen
25 employed at public higher education institutions; provided, that
26 no member who attains age sixty-five while classified in Group 1
27 may thereafter be classified in Group 2, irrespective of change of
28 employment.
