AN ACT CONCERNING VIOLATIONS OF UNEMPLOYMENT AND WORKERS' COMPENSATION STATUTES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Any person, firm, association or corporation which suffers
2 damages as a result of a competitive bid for a project involving
3 the construction, repair, remodeling, alteration, conversion,
4 modernization, improvement, rehabilitation, replacement or
5 renovation of a building or structure, or portion thereof, not being
6 accepted due to another person, firm, association or corporation
7 knowingly violating the provisions of chapters 151A and/or 152
8 of the General Laws, may bring an action for damages in the
9 superior court. For the purposes of an action brought pursuant
10 to this section, employee status shall be determined by the
11 applicable provisions of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, or
12 any subsequent corresponding Internal Revenue Code of the
13 United States, as from time to time amended.
